

## GRAYSTONE SWIMMING POOL RULES - MAY 2013

All owners and residents are responsible for the conduct and safety of their guest. **THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY. SWIMMING ALONE IS NOT RECOMMENDED. CHILDREN 14 AND UNDER SHOULD NOT USE POOL WITHOUT RESPONSIBLE ADULT SUPERVISION.**

### POOL HOURS:

<b>Monday – Friday:</b>	Open Swim	10 am – 7:30 pm
	Lap Swim	7:30 – 9:00 pm
<b>Saturday &amp; Sunday:</b>	Open Swim	10:00 am to 9:00 pm

The swimming pool and pool area is for the exclusive use of Graystone residents and their guests. The age restriction has been removed in accordance with Federal Fair Housing Regulations.

- All adult residents must sign the register located at the north end of the pool. Residents must sign for themselves and their guests. No one is allowed in the pool area unless properly signed in.
- A resident must accompany all guests at all times.
- The maximum number of guests is 10 per unit.
- Each unit is issued a key for the pool area. The cost to replace a lost key is \$100.00. Residents may not give or loan swimming pool keys to anyone living outside the Graystone complex.

Residents are responsible for the conduct of guests and for informing guests of all **pool rules**. The following are intended to insure all users have a safe and enjoyable experience. The rules must be observed at all times.

Utah State Code R392-302-26, 31, 300

- No running in the pool area.
- Utah State law prohibits smoking in the pool area.
- No alcohol beverages are allowed in the pool area.
- No glass is permitted in the pool area.
- No beverages or food are to be taken within ten feet of the pool.
- No animals are allowed in the pool area.
- Anyone with a communicable disease should not use the pool.
- Children 3 years and under, or any child not toilet trained are only allowed in the pool with appropriate water resistant swim diaper and waterproof swimwear.

In addition;

- Cover lounge chairs with a towel to protect them from damage.
- No cooking or grilling is allowed in the pool area.
- Individual radios are permitted in the pool area but should the volume is low enough so as not to disturb other users or nearby residents.
- Games, pool toys, and activities that are only allowed when a few people are in the pool but are not allowed when the pool is crowded.
- Conduct should not endanger others or interfere with their enjoyment of the pool.
- Please respect others in the pool area.

**FAILURE TO RESPECT THE POOL RULES MAY RESULT IN YOU AND YOUR GUESTS BEING ASKED TO LEAVE THE POOL AREA. REPEATED VIOLATIONS CAN RESULT ION THE LOSS OF POOL PRIVILEDGES.**
